Over the past year, we have heard a lot of talk about the desire for things to return back to normal. Where we could get back to doing the things that we always used to do, but sometimes took for granted. Little things, like dropping the kids off at school and then stopping to meet a friend for coffee. Or having a neighborhood cookout and watching the kids splash around in the pool on a hot summer afternoon. Or visiting Grandma in the assisted living facility that she now calls home. Just the average day to day activities that make up the fabric of our sometimes hectic lives. Normal. That's what we've all been hoping for.

The families that we serve at Hilton Head Heroes are in a constant struggle of desperately seeking to return back to normalcy every day. From the initial shock of hearing that their child has cancer, needs a transplant, must begin treatments immediately or only has a slight chance of surviving, normal disappears for these families in the blink of an eye.

When you have a child facing a life threatening illness, the entire family gets rocked to its core. One of the parents usually has to stop working in order to give daily care to their child, while the other parent may have to work two jobs in order to try to keep up financially. As the parents shuttle back and forth between hospital visits and treatments, the siblings are often left in the care of relatives or babysitters. Virtually nothing in their lives is normal for extended periods of time. And in many cases, they never find their way back to normal.

Over twenty years ago, our Heroes program was created to give these families a brief glimpse of normal. Together, they might build a sandcastle on the beach, watch a dolphin playing in the Calibogue Sound or take a bike ride under the canopy of massive oaks in the Sea Pines Resort. They swim in the pool at The Hero House, eat fried shrimp at a local restaurant and have a beautiful family photo taken on the beach at sunset. And then, after a week away from the challenges they are facing at home, they return back to their normal. We hope they go back home refreshed, encouraged and uplifted by the love shown to them by our amazing community.









### "It Takes A Village"

- How do you get the Hero applicants? Hero applicants are referred to us from an established network of social workers across the United States. We are constantly adding to our referral list.
- How do you choose the Hero Families? Hilton Head Hero families fill out a 12-page application packet, which can be found on our website, hhheroes.com. This application includes medical verification of illness, release of liability forms, general information forms, and new in 2021 a Covid-19 liability release form.
- **Who qualifies?** Families with a child suffering from a life-threatening illness qualify for a Hero vacation. Please carefully read the rules before applying to see if your family qualifies.






